- -Again Congress has ignored the Clergy Act of 2020 bill submitted in February of 2020. (The bill is H.R. 5904) that would allow ministers who exempted out of social security and medicare to opt back in. Do know, there are many ways you still might be eligible for social security even if you did opt out. Ask our tax professionals if you have questions.
- -Please make sure to include all honorarium and expenses (including mileage) associated with them. We need the actual miles (not miles multiplied by mileage rate).
- -Please let us know what specific dates each taxpayer was out of country.
- -Remember your out-of-pocket unreimbursed business expenses can help reduce your social security and medicare tax

- -Please make sure we receive information on any estimated tax payments AND dates you made each of them (IRS and the states go off these dates)
